What is communion?

Communion is a symbolic way to show we belong to Jesus and to remember what He did for us. It's a regular remembrance and celebration of the Lord's sacrificial death. The breaking and eating of bread has to do with Christ's body being broken on the cross. The drinking from the cup has to do with the shedding of Christ's blood, whereby we are forgiven. (Matthew 26:26-28; 1 Corinthians 11:23-24).

A big part of communion is remembering and reflecting. Remember the sacrifice and promise that Jesus made. Communion should also involve personal reflection. It's a time to examine our relationship with the Lord and with others. Communion should lead to praise. Jesus has made a way for us to receive forgiveness and life! Often communion is a joyous celebration- a reminder of our great God. We don't have communion because of obligation. We have communion as a proclamation of Jesus' promise of salvation! Join us as we honor the Lord in worship through participating in the Lord's Communion on March 19th during the morning service.
